SUBJECT: National Infrastructure Protection Plan and Critical Infrastructure and Key Resources Annex Awareness Workshop

As part of our effort to continuously improve how we convey a working knowledge of our operational processes and procedures to our regional, state, local, territorial, tribal and private sector partners, DHS Office of Infrastructure Protection's National Infrastructure Protection Plan (NIPP) Program Management Office (PMO), in collaboration with FEMA Region VIII, is conducting a NIPP and National Response Framework (NRF) Critical Infrastructure and Key Resources (CIKR) Annex Awareness Workshop in Denver, CO, FEMA Region VIII Headquarters, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on April 21st, 2009.

This event is designed to familiarize regional emergency management, public safety, and private sector CIKR owners/operators with the NIPP and CIKR Annex, including the framework and mechanisms for coordinating CIKR protection and preparedness efforts and incident management activities among all stakeholders. It will also serve to further enhance relationships between IP and our public and private CIKR partners throughout the regions by incorporating the participation of IP's Protective Security Advisor Program (PSA), Chemical Facility Anti-Terrorism Standards (CFATS), Sector Specific Agency Executive Management Office (SSA EMO) and National Infrastructure Coordinating Center (NICC) representatives.

This workshop will be organized into two sessions. The morning session will consist of NIPP and CIKR Annex familiarization courses led by Mr. Jim Caverly, Director of IP's Partnership and Outreach Division (POD). The afternoon session will consist of scenario-based discussions and direct interaction with relevant IP representatives. This structure will give attendees an opportunity to discuss and understand the role that IP plays in supporting the critical infrastructure protection efforts of public and private sector entities at all levels, and how this support is provided during both steady-state operations and during an incident.

Specific venue location and other logistical information will be sent to invitees in the near future. Participation will be limited to 80 attendees (attendance at this event is by invitation only; please do not forward). Parking Directions

Our campus is located in east Denver, the north border being Montview Boulevard, the south border 17th Avenue, west border Oneida, and east Quebec.

From I-70 east or west: Exit onto Quebec Avenue South. Continue on Quebec Avenue for approximately 2.9 miles to 17th Avenue. Turn right onto 17th Avenue. Turn Right into the parking lot that is bordered by 17th Avenue and Quebec. Walk northwest to the College of Business, building 5.

From I-25 south: Exit onto Colorado Boulevard North. Continue for three miles to 6th Avenue. Turn right onto 6th Avenue and continue for 1.5 miles to Monaco Parkway. Turn left onto Monaco Parkway and continue for 1-2 miles to 17th Avenue. Turn right onto 17th Avenue. Continue to past Pontiac Street, and then make a left turn into the parking lot. Walk northwest to the College of Business, building 5.

Please note, although these lots are marked “permit only” there will be no parking enforcement on Campus Property. Parking on the street is subject to Denver Parking Regulations, and they do ticket!
